All materials are included for the workshops and forest school.

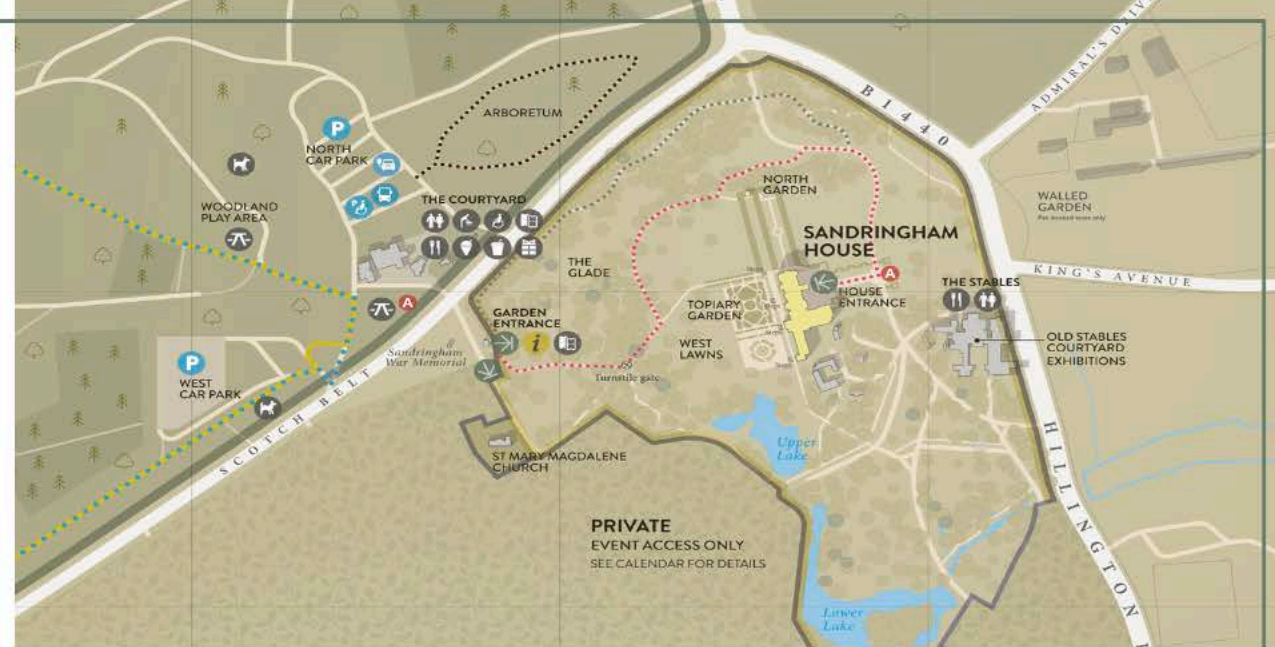
Educational Visits take place from Monday - Friday

Forest School Sessions are available all year round. Our workshops are specially designed to be open ended and flexible to your specific themes and learning and suit all learners. We can offer bespoke differentiated workshops and activities according to your school's curriculum coverage requirements.

PLANNING

Pre visits for up to two teachers can be arranged.

When you book a visit with workshops, the School Room will be reserved for your school as the base for the day. The School Room is located at the Stables in the Gardens which is approx a 15 minute walk from the Garden entrance.

Please note: that from November to April the Gardens and House are not open to the public and the workshops are completely outdoors in the woodlands. Forest Schools go ahead in most weathers however will not take place if windspeeds are over 42mph.

Facilities at Sandringham are located:

- in the Courtyard at the Visitors Centre
- in the Courtyard at the Stables (inside the Gardens)

We offer complimentary tickets to accompanying teachers in line with the following teacher-pupil ratio guidelines:

Age 5-7 - ratio 1:5

Age 8-18 - ratio 1:10

Additional Adults will be charged at the standard rate of £13 per person

Minimum booking of 20 pupils.
